• Contest must meet the following GPA requirements in ible to receive the TEACH grant:

- Incoming freshman: Have a high school c unulative, unweighted grade point average of a 3.25 on a 4.0 grading scale.
- Incoming transfer and graduate students: It ave a transferable cumulative, grade point average of a 3.25 GPA on a 4.0 grading scale.
- Current HBU students: Have a HBU grade point average of a 3.25 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 grading scale.
- Register for coursework leading to teacher certification.
